

Career Life Connections 12 — 2019-20 Capstone Project

What is the Capstone Project?

The Capstone Project allows you to demonstrate your learning as you explore area(s) of interest that you are passionate about and that you anticipate you might possibly be pursuing after graduation. It will involve you choosing your topic, submitting a proposal, having your proposal accepted, researching your topic, keeping an Action Log recording what you do throughout your learning exploration, and presenting a representation of your learning journey. Your presentation to a community member will include discussing **who** you are and what makes you unique, sharing your possible post-graduation plans, and sharing the highlights of your learning journey which culminated in your final project. After you present, you are required to submit a document explaining what core competencies you developed through your exploration and explaining what you learned about yourself throughout your learning journey.

What are you passionate to learn about?

There are many **TYPES** of Capstone Project choices. You could do any of the following types of project:

- 1. A **Service-Oriented Capstone**: a project where you research an issue of interest that is affecting your community and develop and implement a solution
- 2. An Artifact Capstone: a project where you would construct a specific, tangible object
- 3. An Event Capstone: a project where you would create and run your own major event
- 4. A **Career Capstone**: a project where you would explore / develop skill(s) related to your future career-life goals
- An Entrepreneurship Capstone: a project where you start a new business initiative
- 6. A **Research / Experiment Capstone**: a project where you design, implement and present an experiment with which you would develop new arguments and/or insights
- 7. Other: Do you have another idea? Run it by Ms. Jackson or Ms. Larisch.

Examples:

- a robot you built
- fundraising you did to help homeless cats or an environmental issue
- a sports event organized by you at a local elementary school
- a deep exploration of a career area of interest compiled into an artifact of some sort
- a final art piece / animation / fashion line / portfolio / slide show / etc. highlighting your journey
- a Ted Talk-like speech given live and with supporting visuals
- etc.

The Presentation:

Presentations will take place on **April 16th**, **2020** and need to be between 7-10 minutes in length with an additional 5 minutes available for a question period. Visual aids are a requirement, and you will be expected to dress in a manner that is appropriate for a business interview. The presentation needs to include an introduction of yourself, the sharing of your post-graduation plans and options, the sharing of your Capstone topic / question, the sharing of what you learned throughout the project process, the explanation of the representation you created for your project, and the sharing of what new questions / goals you have for the future.

Action Logs:

Action Logs are required to show your learning from the beginning of your Capstone journey. The form is used to log the time you spend working on your proposal, your research, your learning and your representation.

It will be reviewed as **one of the ways you demonstrate your effort with this project.

Requirements:

- ✓ includes hours of exploration time spent between October and March
- √ includes research components
- ✓ includes components about accessing information from people (conversations, interviews, etc.)
- ✓ includes "do" components your time spent applying your research and creating your project

After your presentation, you are required to type up the following questions (template available on the website) and detailed answers to them:

- 1. What did you learn about yourself through this Capstone journey?
- 2. What core competencies did you develop and how did you develop them?
- 3. What are you most proud of?
- 4. What uncertainties / challenges did you experience?
- 5. What questions do you still have?
- 6. How will this learning journey affect your career-life decisions?

First Task:

Your first task is to complete and submit the Capstone Proposal (see attached pages) to the Career Centre.

**Remember: Your Action Log should reflect ALL the work you do on your Capstone Proposal; therefore, the research you do and conversations you have before you actually decide on your specific project should be a part of your Action Log as well.
