Old Business:

Clarification of new curriculum requirements for Career Life Ed. Career Life Education Clarification volunteer/work hours:

"Students are required to do a minimum of 30 hours of Career Exploration hours in order to graduate. They usually do these 30 hours as work experience, and students who are in the 80 hour program can use 30 of their hours to count as their Career Exploration hours. Paid work can be counted but that is dependent on their Capstone presentation focus and so they need to discuss this with their CLC teacher prior to the hours being approved.

External Credentials are different – the hours must be approved by the student's counseller. The following link lists the organizations that have already been approved: https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/graduation/getting-credit-to-graduate/external-credentials/organizations-offering-approved-external-credentials. Due to the new curriculum being in draft form, at this point no new external credentials will be considered until the review of curriculum is complete."
