## How long do the students have to complete their 30 volunteer hours?

30 hours can start after grade 10 – must complete their workplace safety first

# Where does this class fit in? How much time should they be spending on each assignment?

Grade 11 is all on top of other classes, on their own time, spans the school year and about 6 weeks per assignment.

# Course selection – how do we choose the CLC 11 course – we didn't see it in the course outline.

It is not in the course selection as it is required for everyone. For work experience they may choose either the 30 hour volunteer hours or the 80 hour elective course.

## How are the students meeting their volunteer hours?

Many students already started their volunteer hours prior to the pandemic. They can now do a 30 hour service assignment at home – they can wash dishes, walk the neighbour's dog, etc if they feel really stuck and can't get out into the community at large.

## Capstone project evaluation – how will it be done this year?

Presentations have been turned into a 2 format assignment. One part is written out – what they would have said in their presentation. The second part is a PowerPoint presentation. Ms. Larisch is evaluating all of them this year.

## Principal's report: Andy Chin

- Covid-19, one exposure on Feb 2-5, they have recovered and doing well
- Different process for the exposures from now on, Fraser Health will call the principal directly and the school will be involved in the students who will have to isolate
- Q2 report cards posted Feb 9 and honour roll will be distributed in the next 2 weeks
- Course selection is complete, maybe 80 students left
- Enrollment projections are about the same for next year about 20 cross-district applications
- Pride Week was successful
- Update on school safety protocols emphasis on physical distancing, signage in café and constant reminders to students

- Lots of sanitizer and hand washing stations (3 have
- Masks are worn in every class which is great to see!
- Next Friday is the interim quarter 3 marks
- District and schools have started talking about what school may look like next year no decisions have been made but most likely NOT linear.

### Questions:

Any changes at Cariboo will have to be in alignment with the rest of the District? Yes. We will have to have the same system as the other schools.

## Why have the Covid-19 exposure / isolation procedures changed?

Principals know who's in the class and who should be isolating – more than the contact information that is sometimes given by the person who is Covid-19 positive.

Any opportunity to move to a semestered system for next year rather than quarter system? Quarter system is so hard on the kids especially in classes such as math or sciences.

The quarter system seems to be the best to keep cohorts small.
